Dear Mr. Glasgow:

I am hereby – once again - formally requesting that the Will County State's Attorney's Office vacate Chester Weger's conviction for the murder of Lillian Oetting. In addition to all of the overwhelming evidence we have already submitted to you that proves Chester's innocence, we have now received new powerful and credible forensic evidence that conclusively and undoubtedly proves Chester's innocence.

As you know, Othram has conducted genetic genealogy testing on one of several hairs that were found on the left index finger glove of Frances Murphy. The results of that testing have determined that this hair originated from one of four brothers who were local to the Starved Rock area. We have already provided you with the names of those four brothers. The only explanation for this hair being found on the finger of Frances Murphy is that this person was involved in the murders.
