

"No Comment"

Reid Replies

CHICAGO (UP) — Criminologist John Reid, who had given a lie detector test to Darrell Parker, Lincoln, before Parker confessed the slaying of his wife, said Tuesday night he had "no comment" on the results of new lie detector tests given Parker.

Attorneys for Parker said tests given Parker Jan. 4-5 showed "Parker definitely had no connection with the murder of his wife."

The additional tests were given by another expert examiner, George W. Robinson, Kansas City, Mo.

Lancaster County Attorney Elmer Scheele said Reid had given such tests to more than 25,000 persons during a 15-year span.

However, Reid did say that a repudiation of a confession is "typical of such cases." He said the attorneys are "running true to form" in defense of the case.

Reid said "let the trial speak for itself."
