I heard the Amore party say that they sure have a big write up on the Marder Case in tonight's namer. You know the kid has bloodsteined overalls in the trunk of the car and he's getting a little armious to know what he's going to do with them. He's afreid he'll get carefut. LaSalle Party says, He'll tell him to got rid of them. Burn them. End of conservation relating to the Hurder.

In further conversation which I did not listen very closely to, I sethered the impression that the LaSelle party was an auto dealer. They were talking about a business deal partaining to cars and the LaSalle party said he had the money to so sheed with the deal. It save so the impression that it was a bigger deal then just the purchase of one car: more like the purchase of a business or business lomation partaining to care.

I was so astonished that I really could'est concontrate on listening to the rest of the conversation so I heard no closing remarks or names mentioned. The Amora voice I can't forget. It was a voice that gave the impression of an unadvanted person. Harsh, door, voice, no softwees in it at all. Limited vecabulary. to promuned characteristic such as dis, dass, das, lie foreign or nationality traits or hillbilly tones. Cave impression that might be big, burly man. Talked like a sen who would'nt care such or think about anything to deeply. Bave impression that he was reporting to the boss, not servous or worried.

The LeSalle voice just a natural man's voice, low, soft. "Sunded used to talking to remplo, a typical salesmen's voice and manner of speech. No outstanding characteristics. He seemed to be the dominant one of the two.

Once during the conversation the LeSalle Party hasitated, told Aurora to wait a minute, as though possibly some one had come within hearing distance. Aurore Party was courteous when notified of time limit, then at completion of call when I rune him back to collect overtime charges, he said don't worry, I won't run quay. This was definitely a call from a pay station in Aurora. The LaSalle number may or may not be a pay station. The LaSalle number began with a Capitol 5-(Subsequent check with information shows that there is no Capitol 5. All LaSalle phone numbers are Capitol 3.)

I was uncertain what to do after hearing this conservation.
