# Three Children Found Slain In Their Beds

SENECA — (Special) — A young Seneca couple and their three children were found shot to death in their home about 9:30 a. m. today.

La Salle county authorities were unable to immediately determine whether all had been murdered, and or that the case was a murder-suicide.

The victims were identified as William Winders, 29, his wife, Patricia, 28, and their three children, all under five years of age.

It was reported that the children were found dead in their beds, apparently shot to death while asleep.

Investigating the case were Deputies William Dummett and Floyd Conkling, an assistant state's attorney and Irvin Kross of Leland, La Salle county coroner.

Sheriff Ray Eutsey and other deputies on his staff were notified of the shootings at Starved Rock State Park where they are pressing the investigation of the slayings of three Chicago suburban women last Monday.

Authorities said the Winders children were slain in their heds with a pistol and the bodies of their parents were found in another part of the residence.

# Find Family of 5 Slain;

Seneca, Ill., March 19 (UPI).-A factory worker, his wife and their three children were found shot to death in an apparent murder-suicide today in their home 20 miles from Starved Rock State Park.

Police sought a possible link with the sex slayings Monday of three Chicago area women in the park. But they considered such a link only a remote possibility.

#### Neighbors Were Fearful

Sheriff's deputies at Seneca, called by fearful neighbors, found the bodies of William Winders, 30; his wife, Patricia, 27; and their three children, Debbie, 6, Mike, 5, and Leslie, 2, in their

one-story white frame home. Deputies said Winders, who worked in the National Biscuit Co.'s carton factory at nearby Marseilles, apparently shot his

three children as they lay in bed. shot his wife and then killed him-

#### Shotguns Taken Out

Winders and his wife were sprawled in the living room of their home. A .22 caliber pistol was lying near Winders.

Mrs. Winders aparently tried to protect her children and herself, with two shotguns, deputies said. Both guns had been removed from their cases and broken open. But Mrs. Winders apparently couldn't -find any shells.

All the victims were shot in the head. Deputies said neighbors called police after noticing lights had been burning in the Winders' home since Thursday night, when the killings apparently occurred.

Police discounted a theory that the family was wiped out in a fit of remorse over the Starved Rock murders. However, La Salle County authorities and state police sent investigators to Seneca.

#### Fall Kills Patient

William Dustre, 42, of 511 Washington St., Newark, fell 12 stories to his death yesterday at Martland Medical Center, Newark. Dustre, suffering pneumonia, had been a patient there since Feb. 15.

### Family of Five **Found Slain**

For two nights, Mrs. Otis Virgo corried about her neighbors, the William Winders family.

Lights burned in the living room and the children's bedroom of the neat frame house. Mrs. Virgo thought one or more of the Winders' three children might be sick. She thought of calling to of-fer aid Friday morning, but de-cided not to. Today she decided to act.

She telephoned the Winders' but got no answer. She knocked on the front door, but no one answered. Then she called Mayor James Thompson.

Thompson and Virgil Sheedy, Manlius County supervisor, summonded Bill Dummitt, a LaSalle County deputy sheriff, and the three forced their way into the

The Winders, mother, father and children were dead. The lights were still burning. The television set was on.

Dummitt said a pistel lay on the floor close to William's body in the living room. Apparently, he said, the 29-year-old factory worker had slain his wife, Patricia, 27, and then the children.

Debbie, 6, and Michael, 5, lay in their beds in the room they shared. Leslie, 2, lay in his crib in another room.

Dummitt said relatives and friends of the Winders were unable to think of a reason why Winders an employe of the Na-tional Biscuit Co. at its Mar-seilles, Ill., plant, would have taken the lives of his family and himself.

However, Asst. State's Atty. John Wolslegel quoted a friend of the dead woman as saying Mrs. Winders had talked about marital troubles in recent weeks and once described her husband as a "pecullar man."



### **Authorities Lean To Theory** Placing Death Weapon In Hands Of Wife

State laboratory tests have failed to reveal any powder deposits on the hands of either William Winders, 29, or his wife, Patricia, 27. that might indicate who wielded the gun that brought death to them and their three children, in their Seneca home 10 days ago.

They were shot with a .22 caliber target pistol. The bodies of the children were found in their beds, while the husband and wife were found in the living room,

At first authorities assumed that the husband did the shooting, but now they are convinced that the gun was fired by the wife. Her fatal wound was in the temple and he was shot in the forehead, which authorities say would be almost impossible with the type of pistol that was used.

The bodies were discovered Saturday, March 19, and the shooting is believed to have occurred the prior Thursday night.

Wednesday, Mrs. Winders had visited a minister, the Rev. Roy Wilson, seeking spiritual guidance. The Rev. Wilson said she was quite despondent.

The children were Debra Lynn, 6, Michael Roy, 5, and Leslie W., 2.

## JURY RULES HOUSEWIFE KILLED FAMILY, SELF

OTTAWA-(UPI)-A coroner's jury ruled Monday night that Mrs. William Winders, 27, killed her husband, her three children and herself.

The five bodies were found in the Winders' home at Seneca March 19. Authorities said they had been dead two days. Tests were made to determine which of the victims fired the shots that killed them but they were inconclusive.

The coroner's jury based its finding on positions of the bodies.
